College/School/Program Overview

The Department of Theology and Philosophy at Barry University invites applicants for a full-time continuing contract position in the field of **Liturgical and Sacramental Theology** at the assistant professor level, beginning in August 2020.

Position Summary (General Description of Position)

The position requires the ability to teach the graduate and undergraduate courses in theology, to advise and mentor students, to engage in scholarly work, and to serve on departmental, college, and university committees.

Essential Functions (Duties and Responsibilities)

Responsibilities include a 3-3 undergraduate and/or graduate level teaching load, active involvement in the department's theological graduate programs, and participation in the collegial and intellectual life of the university.

The position is open with regard to area of specialization, methodological commitments, and ecclesial location. However, facility with the Catholic liturgical and sacramental tradition, ability to correlate the relationship between liturgy and ecclesiology, and experience with praxis-theory-praxis methods of practical theology is strongly preferred. Experience with developing and teaching distance courses is welcomed.

Additional responsibilities include academic advising and mentoring to undergraduate and graduate students, supervision of thesis projects, departmental and college service, university service, community service, and sustained scholarship.

Qualifications/Requirements

The position requires an earned Ph.D. in Theology. Applicants are required to send their *curriculum vitae*, statement of intent, samples of publications and syllabi, and three letters of recommendation from senior scholars to Gloria L. Applications received by **November 1, 2019** will receive full consideration. Initial interviews will be conducted at the American Academy of Religion Convention November 23–26, 2019. Review of applications will continue until the position is filled.
